Overview of U.S./Canada Quota Trading

- Transboundary Management Guidance Committee (TMGC) developed draft trading principles in February 2013
 - Recommended pilot project
- Steering Committee met in April 2013
 - Accepted draft trading principles
 - Formed working group

Implementation of Trading for 2013

- Trading Pilot Project
 - Potential for a trade in fall 2013
 - U.S. could receive additional quota for fishing year (FY) 2013 in return for giving additional quota to Canada for FY 2014
 - Might not be feasible for Council to implement a trading mechanism for FY 2013 through Council action
 - Council could request an emergency action for FY 2013

September 24-26, 2013	NEFMC Meeting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Council selects preferred 2014 U.S./Canada quotas • Further input from Council on FY 2013 trade
January 1, 2014	Canadian FY 2014 begins	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canada begins fishing under 2014 quotas including any trades • Possible emergency action implemented for FY 2013 trade?
May 1, 2014	U.S. FY 2014 begins	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Final U.S. quotas in place

Implementation of Trading for 2014 and Beyond

- May require an amendment
- Short-Term
 - In this year's groundfish framework, could add measure that would give Regional Administrator authority to modify U.S./Canada quotas inseason
- Long-Term
 - Could develop more complex trading mechanism through an amendment
