New England Fishery Council To Hold Safety Hearings

Newburyport, MA Following a number of important industry meetings concerning fishing vessel safety procedures, the New England Fishery Management Council will hold its own series of port meetings to discuss how fishery rules might be reexamined to be more risk averse in matters of personal health and safety.

While fishery regulations were not found to be the cause of several recent fishing vessel sinkings and loss of life, New England Fishery Management Council Chairman Frank Blount and Executive Director Paul Howard are encouraging fishermen, interested community members and the public to engage in a constructive dialogue on the topic. The discussions will focus on identifying factors that affect safety and how the Council might better promote safer vessel operations through alternative management strategies.
