Scallops

I. STATUS

Since the October Council meeting the Scallop Committee has met once (November 3), the advisory panel has not met, and the PDT has met once (October 27). The focus of meetings have been to discuss potential response to NMFS turtle biological opinion, develop alternatives for ACLs in Amendment 15, and review range of alternatives currently under consideration in Amendment 15.

II. COUNCIL ACTION

- Discuss and approve a response to the NMFS Biological Opinion for the scallop fishery concerning sea turtle interactions.
- Review list of alternatives under consideration for Amendment 15; at the October Council meeting the Council requested that the Scallop Committee refine the list of alternatives in light on new scallop action timelines. The Council asked the Committee to seriously consider the IFQ alternative and an alternative that would convert open area DAS into a number of "trips" within open areas.
- Under a separate agenda topic (Scallop vessels incidental catch of Yellowtail Flounder) the Council will discuss options to address yellowtail incidental catch by scallop vessels.
