Scope of Omnibus expanded

- Council voted in April to expand scope of action to include evaluation and possible changes to "year-round groundfish rebuilding closures"
- This influences the development strategy and also the timeline

Updated NOI/request for comments

- NOI prepared informing public of decision to expand scope – published on 6/17/2011 – on NEFMC website
- Requesting comments on:
 - Change in scope
 - Issues related to the development of EFH impacts minimization alternatives
 - Utility of existing or alternative closures to address the needs of groundfish stocks
 - Impacts of changes to the existing closures on groundfish fishing and other activities (such as Special Access Programs, exempted/certified bycatch fisheries, recreational fishing opportunities, endangered or threatened species protection, etc.)

Development strategy in brief

- Develop habitat management options
- Develop groundfish management options
- Combine options into sets of packaged alternatives
- Council approves alternatives for analysis
- Council selects preferred alternatives, public hearings, etc.
- Council approves amendment

Habitat management options

- Minimize adverse effects to EFH from fishing
 - Modify/eliminate some of the current habitat areas, change gear restrictions
 - Add new habitat areas measures for these areas could include gear modifications, effort limits, closure to certain gears
 - Frameworkable items?
 - Research areas

Habitat management options

- Minimize fishing effects on deep-sea corals
 - Deep-sea coral zones
 - Both localized (i.e. single canyon) and broad (i.e. large region of continental slope) have been discussed
 - Restrictions as necessary within coral zones
 - Frameworkable items
 - Research-related measures

Recent and upcoming meetings

- PDT June 8-9 discussed areas appropriate for adverse effects minimization options; discussed strategy for coral areas
- PDT conference calls late June/early July
- Advisory Panel July 20 review current options and updated PDT info
- Committee July 21 receive updated PDT recommendations and refine options

Timeline (approximate)

- Summer 2011 refine habitat management options
- September 2011 present habitat options to Council
- Winter 2011 groundfish committee/PDT begin review of groundfish areas and associated management options
- Spring 2012 present groundfish options to Council
- Late Spring 2012 combine habitat and groundfish options into packaged alternatives
