The TRAC stock assessment for Atlantic herring occurred on June 8, 2009, and results are anticipated shortly thereafter. The 2010-2012 specifications, therefore, should incorporate the new stock assessment information. According to the Magnuson Stevens Reauthorization Act, the Council must receive a recommendation regarding allowable biological catch (ABC) for the 2010-2012 fishing years from its Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC), and ACL/AM provisions must apply for the 2011 and 2012 fishing years. As a result, the specifications process, will be more complicated than it has been in the past and will consume most technical and staff resources that may be available during the 2009 summer/fall months.

In order to ensure that the ACL/AM provisions can be implemented by the start of the 2011 fishing year, the Council must submit the ACL/AM action (i.e., Amendment 4) to NMFS no later than May 2010. To do this would require completion of the development of alternatives and the Draft EIS for Amendment 4 during the fall of 2009; this is highly unlikely since the range of alternatives for catch monitoring and measures to address other issues in the amendment (river herring, groundfish closed area access) are not fully developed, and Council staff/Herring PDT work will be diverted to the specifications process for much of the upcoming months.

Based on the following timeline, if Amendment 4 is split, the ACL/AM provisions would move forward in Amendment 4, developed in conjunction with the 2010-2012 herring fishery specifications, and submitted together with appropriate environmental compliance documents no later than December 2009. This approach would ensure that the ACL/AM provisions can be implemented for the 2011 fishing year, consistent with the

requirements of the MSRA. The ACL/AM provisions in Amendment 4 are largely process-related and are unlikely to trigger an EIS, although consideration of this issue needs to be made throughout the development of the amendment. Similar considerations will need to be made relative to the 2010-2012 fishery specifications.

Atlantic herring fishery specifications for 2010-2012 fishing years would be submitted in December 2009 (probably late December), resulting in a delay in implementation for the 2010 fishing year. A rollover provision exists in the current regulations to allow the fishery to continue under the 2009 TACs until the 2010 TACs become effective, and catch during the beginning of 2010 would be counted retroactively against the TACs once the specifications are implemented (the 2010-2012 fishery specifications package would include language to indicate this).
