

Amendment 19 Process

- Benchmark assessment produced MSY proxy reference point recommendations
 January 2011
- SSC approval of ABCs for northern and southern stocks (assessment update) – August 2011
- Oversight Committee and Advisors developed ACLs and AMs – Sep to Dec 2011
- Council approved alternatives and identified preferred alternatives – Jan 2012
- Public hearings Apr 2012
- Approve final alternatives Apr 2012
- Supplement public hearing May 2012
- Approve final alternatives June 2012

Secretarial Amendment Effective May 1, 2012

- Secretarial Amendment will implement ACLs and AMs based on science developed for Amendment 19.
- Status quo/No action
- ACLs with stock wide annual TALs will be implemented on May 1.
- Incidental possession limits apply when landings reach 90% of the TAL – 400 lbs. red hake; 1000 lbs. silver hake.
- Post season AMs: pound for pound reduction in ACL when ACL is exceeded.
- Annual monitoring

Draft Amendment 19

- Considers a broader range of alternatives
- Would take effect in late 2012/early 2013.
- Small-mesh exemption area landings targets in northern stock area (non-preferred alternative)
- Quarterly TALs in southern stock area (preferred alternative)
- Broader range of in-season AMs, incidental possession limits
- Different annual monitoring process
- Different post-season AMs.

Summary of Approved Final Alternatives


- New overfishing definitions
- Three-year specifications
- Annual monitoring reports prepared by NMFS and reviewed by Whiting PDT
- Stock-wide annual TAL for northern area
- Stock-wide annual TAL for southern area, with quarterly allocations implemented in the second year after landings exceed 2/3rds of the TAL, after consultation with the Council.






Small-mesh Multispecies Specification Outline


With Initial Allocations for FY 2012-2014





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Southern Stock Area TAL and AM Management Alternatives

Non-preferred Alternative



Southern whiting possession limit alternatives

Up to 40,000 lbs. in all southern Exemption Areas Section 5.7.4.1

40,000 lbs. in all or part of Southern New England Exemption Area Section 5.7.4.2

30,000 lbs. Status quo Section 5.2.2.3





- Increase revenue on distant trips to Georges Bank
 - 36-48 hour trips for one night of fishing to catch 30,000 lbs.
- Counter higher fuel prices and operating costs
- Improve ability of fleet to land optimum yield

- Potential to increase whiting fleet landings by 873,000 lbs. and \$650 thousand.
- Total potential effort shift of 236 trips by 111 vessels, totalling 9.44 million lbs. and \$5.8 million, partly offset by decreased trips in other fisheries.
- 154 of these additional trips by 78 vessels not in whiting fleet.
- Modest price effect (0.6 cents/1-percent landings increase)
- Potential effort increase could be limited by reducing possession limit amount or geographical extent.
- Limits increase of non-target catch of Mid-Atlantic species.

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
