

Sector Administration

- Operations plan requirements
- Annual report requirements
- · ACE for all stocks allocated
- Enforcement provisions if sector disbands/vessel leaves sector

Potential Sector Contributions

- No action: Landings history alone, "most recent" five years
- Alternative 1: Landings history alone, FY 96-2006
- Alternative 2: Landings history and "capacity" (applied to stocks caught)
- Alternative 3: Landings history and "capacity" (applied to all stocks)
- Alternative 4: Landings history and FW 42 allocated Category A DAS, applied to all stocks

Sector Monitoring

- Dockside monitoring and phase-in of at sea observers
 - Coverage to be specified
 - Rough cost estimates for both programs:
 All trips: \$13,000 \$18,000 per vessel (lower if not all trips monitored)
- Sector member liability:
 - Joint and several liability for all or certain sector violations

Effort Controls - Commercial Fishery

- No Action: 18 percent DAS reduction
- Option 2A: 18 percent DAS reduction, expanded differential DAS
- Option 3A: 50 percent DAS reduction, 24hour clock, no differential DAS
- Option 4: 40 percent DAS reduction, restricted gear areas, differential DAS

Recreational Measures - Allocation

 Commercial/recreational allocation for GOM cod and GOM haddock (years 1996-2006 or 2001-2006)

Stock	Years	Preliminary Estimate of Recreational Allocation
GOM Cod (1)	1996 ~ 2006	25.1%
GOM Cod (2)	2001 2006	33.7%
GOM Haddock (1)	1996 - 2006	17.6%
GOM Haddock (2)	2001 - 2006	27.5%

Recreational Measures – Mortality Controls

- Options depend on allocation decision. If 1996-2006:
 - GOM cod: 26 in. min, or 6 fish bag limit, or November 1 – April 15 prohibition
 - GOM haddock: 21 in. minimum, or 9 fish bag, or 18 in. and 7 fish bag
- If 2001-2006, minimum size for GOM haddock reduced to 18 inches

Recreational Measures - Other

- Landing fillets:
 - Fillets allowed to be landed with the skin off, legal-sized fish OR
 - Fillets must have at least two square inches of skin on the fillet, <u>legal-sized fillets</u>
- Limits on hooks:
 - Proposed that 2-hook per line limit is removed

Reporting Requirements

- Four broad reporting areas:
- Common pool discard rate:
 - Will be determined, by gear, based on total landings of a stock OR on a trip-by-trip basis
 - Will be based on either the most recent stock assessment OR observer data



Additional Rules and Programs

- Changes to minimum size:
 - Halibut: 41 inches total length
 - Haddock: 18 inches for commercial vessels
- Atlantic wolffish prohibition on retention
- SNE/MA small mesh fisheries gear:
 - All vessels in SNEMA area using bottom trawl gear with a codend smaller than 6.5 inches must use drop chains of at least 12 inches

Additional Rules and Programs Possession of limited access multispecies and scallop permits by the same vessel • GOM haddock sink gillnet pilot program • DAS transfer and leasing programs • Special management programs: - Generally revised to focus efforts on haddock and redfish Annual Catch Limits (ACLs) • A catch level that, if exceeded, triggers an automatic response (Accountability Measure, or AM) to end overfishing ACL will be determined by the Council based on guidance from the PDT. - ACL may be broken into sub-components If the ACL is exceeded, it may be adjusted in subsequent years to prevent overfishing ACLs to be specified this fall **Accountability Measures** • Commercial: - Hard TAC system overlaid with trimester TACs - Differential DAS adjustment/adjustments to DAS - Sectors: Hard TACs • Recreational: adjustments to season, minimum size, or bag limits. Either decided by Council, NMFS, or NMFS after consulting Council
